

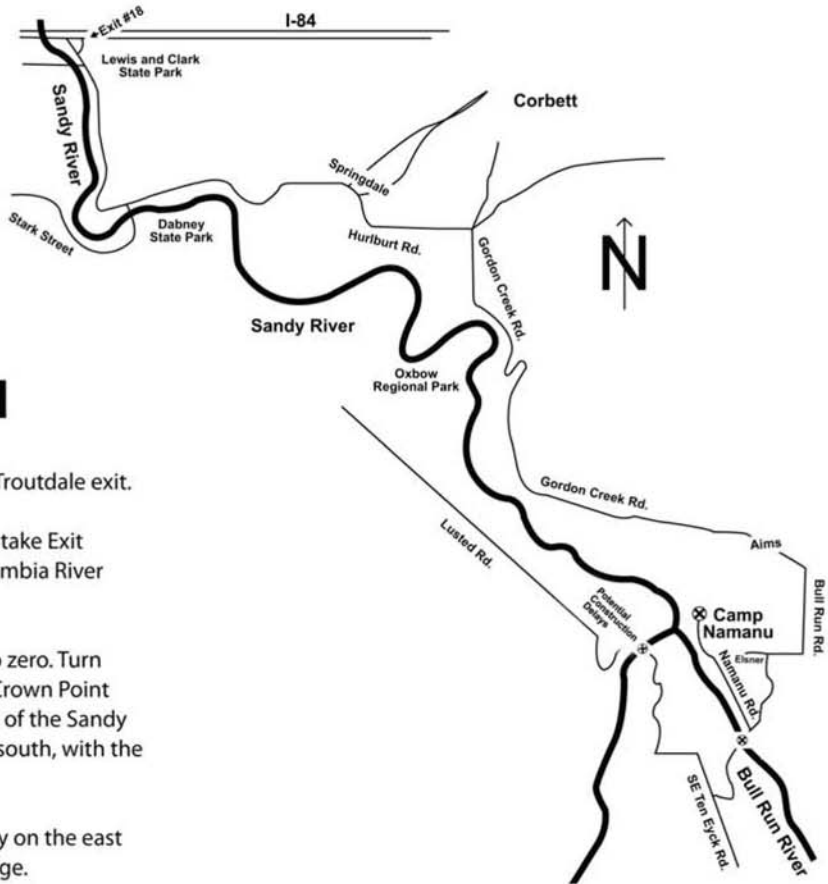
## Directions from I-84

# Directions to Camp Namanu

From Portland drive east on Interstate 84 past the Troutdale exit.

Immediately after the bridge over the Sandy River, take Exit 18 toward what is alternately called the "Historic Columbia River Highway" or the "Crown Point Highway"

- Mile "0"** At the stop sign set your odometer to zero. Turn left on the Historic Columbia River / Crown Point Highway which follows the east bank of the Sandy River upstream. You will be traveling south, with the river on your right.
- Mile .4** Veer left/straight at the stop sign. Stay on the east side of the river, do not cross the bridge.
- Mile 3.3** You will know that you are on course as you pass by Dabney State Park to your right. Continue upriver.
- Mile 4.2** The speed limit will change as you enter Springdale. In Springdale follow the road as it veers to the right; watch for the upcoming sign to Bull Run
- Mile 4.8** Turn right on Hurlburt Road at the "Y". If you look carefully you will see a little white Namanu sign that lets you know you are on track.
- Mile 6.9** Turn right on Gordon Creek Road at the blinking red light, following the small green sign toward Camp Namanu. Expect to stay on this road another approximate 8 - 10 miles as it dips down to the Sandy River, up to the plateau/ridge, and then back down to the Bull Run River. Please note that as you go through the town of Aims, Gordon Creek Road becomes Bull Run Road.



### To Camp Namanu's "Main" camp:

The road will twist and wind as it descends toward the Bull Run River. At Mile 17.2 take a right on Namanu Road, a small gravel road to your marked with a Camp Namanu sign and our trademark Namanu logo. If you reach the bridge over the Bull Run River you will know that you have driven too far. Namanu road signage includes 15 MPH and "appointment only" markers that will let you know you are on track. **PLEASE DRIVE NO MORE THAN 15 MPH ON OUR ENTRANCE ROAD!** This is single lane with turnouts, and the road is destroyed if people try to pass in any other spot but the turnouts that are provided. After a little over a mile you will enter camp, please slow to 5mph as you veer right at the "Y", and find a place in our parking area. Enter camp via the "Grand Staircase" and check in at the House Of Health or Raker Lodge eighty steps below.

### To Camp Namanu's "Ranch" camp:

Mile 15.5 Note that the turnout to the "Ranch" camp is 1.7 miles **before** getting to Namanu Road. Soon after going through the town of Aims on Bull Run Road, watch for a sharp right turn with a 15MPH and "to Sandy" signs. After a long straight away the road will veer left. **Do not** veer left at this juncture, but go straight onto Elsner Road. **PLEASE DRIVE LESS THAN 20 MPH ON THIS ROAD!** The Ranch can be found in a half mile at the end of the road.



## Directions through Sandy

### How to Reach Main Camp

Head east on Highway 26 out of Gresham.

Stay on Hwy 26 through the town of **Sandy**, in the **left** lane. Get into the left turn lane at the light by the Arco Station - a green sign says "**Bull Run-Dodge Park.**" Camp Namanu is approximately 4.3 miles from this point.

Turn **left** and go down the hill and follow the **Ten Eyck Road** signs. There are several hairpin turns; be careful to read signs. At the **Roslyn Lake Reservoir** make a sharp **right** turn onto the **Bull Run Road**. Wind down the hill and across the **Bull Run River**. After crossing the Bull Run River, take the next left turn, which is approximately .25 mile past the river. This is the driveway into Camp Namanu. **There is a small sign on the right indicating entry to Camp Namanu on the left.** Follow the gravel road approximately 1 mile into camp.

Park in the parking lot and walk into camp.

One-way traffic is directed in and out of camp. Please allow up to 20 minutes each way for entering and leaving camp.

### How to Reach Ranch Camp

After crossing the Bull Run River, go past the turn-off to Camp Namanu. Continue up the hill (approximately 2 miles). At the top of the hill, turn left on Elsner Road. This is the first county road on the left side. Follow Elsner Road approximately .75 mile and it will dead-end into the Ranch facility.
